

"The story of the first Black priest in America touches me in a very personal way. It is a journey inward, and his sanctity beckons me to prayer and my own personal pursuit of holiness,"

> Andrae explains. "To play Father Tolton, I need to connect to his humanity. I am seeking not only to play this role, but to become the role I play."

He realizes that there will be many challenges in presenting this drama. "I see my role, particularly as a Black Catholic, as a way to answer the question, 'Who is my neighbor?' Augustus Tolton was on the outside. Rejected by every

seminary in America, he was finally ordained in Rome. I hope this play pushes forward the conversation about what it means to be a truly welcoming Catholic community."

So now we're beginning the production process. Rehearsals start in July, and we're shooting for an October opening. There is so much to do, but we're proceeding in trust, because we believe Tolton will be a significant instrument of healing for the divisions in our country.

guards, angels and Jesus, and the climax of the Easter Vigil at Mount Angel Benedictine Abbey. Our favorite holiday of the year.


Now, with so many of the kids away and on their own, it's hard to get up the energy to do all these things. This year I was ready to cut way back. I'm tired.

It's 11:00 p.m., and you'd expect an 83-year-old retired priest to be tucked up in bed - unless that priest is Father Ed Nadolny.

Father Ed is probably having a lively phone conversation with a complete stranger, one of the countless souls who call

him after seeing his "I LOVE YOU JESUS" billboards scattered along the Connecticut highways like beacons of hope. Along with this outspoken message of faith, Father lists his own personal cell phone number.

He takes calls any hour of the day or night. To those who call to complain about the overt message of faith, he feigns deafness. "What did the billboard

say?" he asks. When the caller grumbles, "It said, 'I love you, Jesus." Father Ed's deafness suddenly disappears. "Well, that's great!" he cries. "I love Jesus, too!"

Father Ed is a firecracker, at once one of the kindest, gentlest, and most fearless people I have ever encountered. Our paths crossed during our Connecticut school tour of



Thérèse, which he organized, sponsored, and funded entirely himself. Young people need the example of the saints more than ever, he believes, so he brought St. Thérèse's Little Way to as many of them as possible.

> Not one to mince words, Father Ed gave me advice on my love life within five minutes of meeting me. (He turned out to be right.) At the same time, he offered such support and inspiration – most of all through

his own example of self-sacrifice. We still keep in touch, although it's hard to get a hold of him. The last time we talked, he kept the conversation short. "I have to go," he said. "I've got to get back to work. I'm raising money to buy keyboards for poor children in South America."





Together you and I can bring these stories of healing and mercy to our divided country. Please join me you're my backstage crew and I'm counting on your support.


